

# FRANCES PERKINS HOMESTEAD

National Historic Landmark

Trails open daily from dawn until dusk

## WELCOME:

The Frances Perkins Homestead was designated a National Historic Landmark by the U.S. Secretary of the Interior in 2014.



Settled by the Perkins family in the 1750s, the Homestead consists of an 1837 Brick House, ell, and barn on 57 acres. The land features woodland and fields, remains of earlier dwelling sites, 2.8 miles of stone walls, and remnants of the family's 19th century brickyard.
